Record of preceding meeting was read by Title and Approved. So Voted.

Communications:

Com. from Fire Chief requesting a transfer of funds in the amount of \$7,142.00 to pay a bill for Tele-Staff's annual service and support. **Motion was made to refer to the Committee on Finance and Salaries and the Mayor's Office. So Voted.**

Com. from Fire Chief requesting a transfer of funds in the amount of \$3,000.00 to pay overtime needed to complete additional work and attend future Tele-conference calls as part of the Tele-Staff implementation. **Motion was made to refer to the Committee on Finance and Salaries and the Mayor's Office. So Voted.**

Departmental Site Plan Review submitted by David Peter, SRT-223 Fremont, LLC, 18 Shoreline Drive, Foxboro for the modification of the site plan approval for the construction of 3 industrial buildings totaling 349,916 sq. ft. at 223 Fremont Street, Taunton. **Motion was made to receive and place on file and provide a copy to the Councilors. So Voted.**

Committee Reports:

Motion was made for Committee reports to be read by Title and Approved. So Voted. Recommendations adopted to reflect the votes as recorded in Committee Reports. So Voted.

Unfinished Business:

Councilor Barbour read a communication from the Fire Chief stating that Greenwood Emergency Vehicles has advised him that Engine #1 will be ready to pickup Thursday, march 12, 2009 and Engine #9 will be ready on March 31, 2009. **Motion was made to receive a follow-up from the Fire Chief after each date and receive participation from the mechanic to be sure the trucks are fixed according to the City's satisfaction. So Voted.**

Councilor Barbour read a communication from Kevin Farrar, TFD Safety Committee discussing his concerns of the Tag System. **Motion was made to invite Mr. Farrar to the Fires and Wires meeting next Tuesday evening. So Voted.**

Councilor Buffington motioned that the Committee to the Council as a Whole instruct Kevin Shea or a representative of the Mayor's Office of Community Development to attend next week's meeting to discuss environmental issues and funding regarding F.B. Rogers. So Voted.

Councilor Buffington motioned that the Committee to the Council as a Whole discuss guidelines regarding storage and custodians for Municipal Council tapes and records. So Voted.

Councilor Carr motioned that the DPW Commissioner and the Police Chief respond to her request to investigate the missing "no parking" sign in front of 4 Monroe Street near Hopewell School that was made at a previous Council Meeting. So Voted.

Councilor Croteau motioned to refer to the Mayor's Office for proper distribution of the following requested status report updates to be provided in writing to the Municipal Council as soon as possible: FY07 and FY08 Audits, F.B. Rogers Project, Dever Wells, Landfill Project, Fire Equipment, Tele-Staff System, All Fire Vehicles. So Voted.

Councilor Costa-Hanlon motioned that the Mayor provides a status on the flail mowers the City has. Additionally, Councilor Barbour motioned that the Commissioner of Parks, Cemeteries and Public Grounds inform the Council how many flail mowers the City has, the condition of them and the age of each. So Voted.

Councilor Costa-Hanlon motioned that the City Solicitor provide the Council with a list of custodians for each department in relation to the Freedom of Publication Act in one week. So Voted.

AN ORDINANCE

CHAPTER 12

Licenses and Miscellaneous Business Regulations

**ARTICLE VI. JUNK, OLD METAL, ANTIQUES AND SECONDHAND
ARTICLES***

Be it ordained by the Municipal Council of the City of Taunton as follows:

'That Section 12-102 of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Taunton, as amended, be and hereby are further amended by adding thereto the following:

By changing Section 12-102 (b) to the following:

(b) It shall be the Licensee's responsibility to require and record the following information for each transaction and sales.

1. A photocopy of the seller's driver's license or photo identification card.
2. License plate number of the vehicle used to convey the material sold to the dealer.
3. Sales slip will contain a legibly written or printed in the English language description of the material purchased, date of purchase, printed name and

signature of seller acknowledging that he/she legally owns the material offered for sale.

4. A photograph of the material offered for sale.
5. Any police officer shall be afforded access to the business to view the bound book, sales slips, and photocopies of driver's licenses at any time during regular business hours.
6. Any violations of the foregoing, after a hearing, shall be a valid reason for immediate revocation of said license, junk, metal, antique and second hand articles, and or a fine of not less than \$200.00 per offense.
7. The licensee shall retain the information obtained pursuant to this section for one year from the date of sale.

Also, by adding the following three sections:

12-103 (c) Stolen Goods. Every licensee who shall receive or be in possession of any goods, articles or things of value that may have been lost or stolen shall upon demand produce such article or thing to any member of the police department for examination.

12-103 (d) Minors. No licensee shall have any business dealings with any person less than 18 years of age, except with the written consent of the parent or guardian of the minor to each particular transaction.

12-103 (e) Severability. The provisions of this ordinance are severable, and if any part of this ordinance should be found to be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the remaining provisions.

All ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon passage. **On a roll call vote, nine (9) Councilors present, nine (9) Councilors voting to move approval. So Voted.**

Ordinance for a third reading to be ordained on a roll call vote

AN ORDINANCE

Chapter 12

Sec. 12-251 Sale and use of air rifles, air guns, BB guns, or pellet guns

Be it ordained by the Municipal Council of the City of Taunton as follows:

- (a) Sale or transfer of air rifles, air guns, BB guns, or pellet guns

(1) It shall be a violation for any dealer to sell, lend, rent, give, or otherwise transfer an air rifle to any person under the age of 18 years, where the dealer knows, or has reasonable cause to believe, the person to be under 18 years of age, or where such dealer has failed to make reasonable inquiry relative to the age of such person, and such person is under 18 years of age.

Any business in the city of Taunton conducting sales of Air Rifles, Air Guns, BB Guns, or Pellet Guns shall maintain in a bound book, a record of all sales. The book shall contain the following information:

- a. Date and time of sale.
- b. A Photocopy of purchaser's photo identification.
- c. Description and serial number of air rifle, air gun, BB gun, or pellet gun.

The record book containing such information shall be available for inspection during normal business hours, upon demand of any city of Taunton Police Officer.

(2) It shall be a violation for any person to sell, give, lend, or otherwise transfer any air rifle, air gun, BB gun, or pellet gun to any person under 18 years of age, except where the relationship of parent and child, guardian and ward or adult instructor and pupil exists between such person and the person under 18 years of age.

(b) Carrying or discharging air rifles, air guns, BB guns, or pellet guns

(1) No minor under the age of eighteen shall have an air rifle, air gun, BB gun, or pellet gun in his possession while in any place to which the public has a right of access unless he is accompanied by an adult or unless he is the holder of a sporting or hunting license and has on his person a permit from the chief of police granting him the right of such possession. No person shall discharge a BB shot, pellet or other object from an air rifle, air gun, BB gun, or pellet gun from or across any street, alley, public way or railroad or railway right of way, and no minor under the age of eighteen shall discharge a BB shot, pellet or other object from an air rifle or BB gun unless he is accompanied by an adult or is the holder of a sporting or hunting license.

(c) Seizure

Any law enforcement officer may seize, take, remove or cause to be removed, at the expense of the owner, all air rifles, air guns, BB guns, or pellet guns used or offered for sale in violation of this section.

(d) No preemption

The provisions of any ordinance enacted by any political subdivision which imposes greater restrictions or limitations in respect to the sale and purchase, use or possession of air rifles, air guns, BB guns, or pellet guns than is imposed by this section, shall not be invalidated or affected by this section.

(e) Penalty

Any person who violates this section shall be liable for a fine of \$100 for the first offense, \$200 for a second offense, and \$300 for a third or subsequent offense.

(f) Definitions

As used in this section the following words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection:

"Air rifle." Any air gun, air pistol, spring gun, spring pistol, BB gun, or any implement that is not a firearm, which impels a pellet of any kind with a force that can reasonably be expected to cause bodily harm.

"Dealer." Any person engaged in the business of selling at retail or renting any air rifles.

All ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon passage. **On a roll call vote, nine (9) Councilors present, nine (9) Councilors voting to move approval. So Voted.**

New Business:

Councilor Barbour stated that a resident of Colonial Estates contacted him stating that she has never had cable and when she contacted Comcast, they stated they could not provide cable to her. Therefore, Councilor Barbour motioned to refer to the Mayor's Office to discuss this situation. So Voted. *(The Assistant City Clerk spoke with Todd in the Mayor's Office on this matter.)*

Councilor Barbour stated that there are "no parking" signs on Fourth Street near BandStandLive however, cars are still parking on the roadway causing residents concern for safety. Therefore, he motioned to refer the parking and safety concerns near BandStandLive to the Police Chief to enforce the "no parking" status and provide an update back to the Municipal Council in two weeks. So Voted.

Councilor Marshall stated he received a communication from the Lamb Memorial Scholarship Committee requesting use of the electronic sign to advertise their upcoming event. **Motion was made to move approval. So Voted.** *(Councilor Marshall stated he would provide a copy of the communication to the Assistant City Clerk)*


