Ordinance for a second reading to be passed to a third reading

AN ORDINANCE

Chapter 19

Sewer and Drains

Sec 19-19. Sewer Rates/Sewer user charges; late penalty.

Be it ordained by the Municipal Council of the City of Taunton and by authority of the same as follows:

That Section 19-19 of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Taunton, as amended, be and hereby is further amended as follows:

1. Delete Section 1 of paragraph (c) and replace with:

SECTION 1:

For the Fiscal Year that begins July 1, 2016, the respective quarterly/monthly billing rates for each connection shall be according to the following fixed service charges that are based on the size of the meter serving the connection.

2. Delete Section 2 of Paragraph (c) and replace with:

SECTION 2.

Two Tiered billing rates:

For bills issued after July 1, 2016:

Step 1: \$1.90 per hcf for usage of 1 to 30 hcf (quarterly bills); and 1 to 10 hcf (monthly bills), respectively.

Step 2: \$6.76 per hcf for the incremental usage in excess of 30 hcf (quarterly bills); and 10 hcf (monthly bills), respectively.

For bills issued after July 1, 2017:

Step 1: \$2.35 per hcf for usage of 1 to 30 hcf (quarterly bills); and 1 to 10 hcf (monthly bills), respectively.

Step 2: \$8.37 per hcf for the incremental usage in excess of 30 hcf (quarterly bills); and 10 hcf (monthly bills), respectively.

For bills issued after July 1, 2018:

Step 1: \$2.72 per hcf for usage of 1 to 30 hcf (quarterly bills); and 1 to 10 hcf (monthly bills), respectively.

Step 2: \$9.68 per hcf for the incremental usage in excess of 30 hcf (quarterly bills); and 10 hcf (monthly bills), respectively.

All ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon passage.



I am happy to present a Memorandum of Agreement (“MOA”) for Fiscal Year 2017 negotiated between Mayor Hoye, his negotiating staff and AFSCME Local 1701 who represents Library Staff and the City Computer Technician.

As you may recall, the City conducted a wage comparison study. That study looked at wages paid to Taunton’s library staff versus ten (10) comparable communities. The study revealed an inequity in wages paid to our library employees. In order to address the inequity, the City negotiated a new pay structure in the attached MOA that addresses that inequity.

I have included the cost breakdown of this Agreement for Fiscal Year 2017. I will be in attendance at the City Council meeting to address any questions that the Council may have.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

This Memorandum of Agreement is entered into this 13th day of April, 2016 by and between the City of Taunton and the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, Council 93 AFL-CIO, Local 1701 Library Union. The purpose of this Memorandum of Agreement is to extend the Collective Bargaining Agreement between the parties, which expires on June 30, 2016. To the extent that this memorandum does not modify the Collective Bargaining Agreement, then said Collective Bargaining Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties, having bargained collectively pursuant to Chapter 150E of the General Laws do hereby agree to the following revisions/amendments/modifications to the Collective Bargaining Agreement and Compensation and Wage Schedule which expires on June 30, 2016.

- 1. The contract will be extended for a period of one (1) year, July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017.
- 2. This Agreement will only apply to Union members who are currently in fulltime active employee status with the Taunton Public Library.
- 3. ARTICLE XVIII- [replace current Article] On July 1, 2016, all AFSCME Council 93 union employees (on staff as of January 1, 2016) at the Taunton Public Library will be placed on Step 2 of the attached Appendix A. The Wage Schedule will remain fixed until June 30, 2020.

The city's Computer Technician will be maintained in a three-step wage scale and receive 2% wage increase. (Appendix B)

The Library Director, will have the ability to place an experienced new hire into a Step between 1 and 3 based on years of previous library experience or education.

Employees with at least six (6) months of experience will move up to the next Step on the Wage Schedule each July 1st.

- 4. The position of Young Adult Librarian will remain vacant through June 30, 2017.


Dear President Quinn and Members of the Municipal Council:

Enclosed please find a copy of the Memorandum of Agreement between the City and the Massachusetts Laborer's Council, Local 1144(A) Laborer's Union. This Agreement, negotiated on behalf of the Mayor by Human Resources Director Maria Gomes, reclassifies certain limited positions within the union.

Under G.L. c.150E, § 7(b), the Mayor is required to submit to the Municipal Council "a request for an appropriation necessary to fund the cost items contained" in the Agreement. Ms. Gomes informs this office that all affected departments already have salary and wage appropriations sufficient to fund the costs thereof.

There being no "appropriation necessary to fund the cost items contained" in the Agreement, therefore, the Agreement is hereby respectfully submitted to the Municipal Council for informational purposes. Thank you, as always, for allowing the Law Department to be of service to you and the citizens of Taunton.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

This Memorandum of Agreement is entered into this _____ day of _____, 2016 by and between the City of Taunton (“the City”) and the Massachusetts Laborer’s District Council, Local 1144 (A) Laborer’s Union (“the Union”). The purpose of this Memorandum of Agreement is to modify the Collective Bargaining Agreement between the parties, which expires on June 30, 2017. To the extent that this memorandum does not modify the Collective Bargaining Agreement, then said Collective Bargaining Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

WHEREAS, by means of impact bargaining, the City of Taunton notified the Union of its desire to modify the current Wage and Classification Plan for Local 1144A;

WHEREAS, the City and the Union have agreed to Modifications for the following positions listed in **ATTACHMENT A, Grade Level V-Water Treatment Plant Operators; Grade Level VII-Electrician, Electronic Technician, HVAC Technician and Plumber (permanently removing positions from Grade Level III); Grade Level VIII- Head Plumber and Head Electrician (permanently removing positions from Grade Level V);**

AND, the City has agreed to promote Deborah Terra after she has obtained her Water Treatment Operator Grade 3 license to Grade Level V, Step 1, after which time her position shall be removed from Grade Level IV;

AND, the Union has agreed to allow the City to hire new Water Treatment Plant Operators into Grade Level 4, Step 5 with a promotion to **Grade Level V, Step 1** after their second year anniversary as a Water Treatment Plant Operator and obtainment of a Grade 3T, after which time, the Water Treatment Plant Operator position held by such person shall be removed from Grade IV;

NOW THEREFORE, the parties, having bargained collectively pursuant to Chapter 150E of the General Laws do hereby agree to the above listed modifications to the Collective Bargaining Agreement which expires on June 30, 2017. Said changes to be effective May 1, 2016 (No Step advancements will be allowed for any individuals impacted by this Agreement until after July 1, 2016)
