Regular Meeting

Mayor Thomas C. Hoye, Jr. presiding

At this time Mayor Hoye asked for a moment of silence for those who lost their lives during the Boston Marathon Bombing yesterday including those injured and all the families affected.

Record of preceding meeting was read by Title and Approved. So Voted.

Communications from City Officers:

Com. from Chairman, Taunton Planning Board – Proposed Zoning Map Amendment – County Street. A request to rezone from Urban Residential District to Highway Business District-Property ID 93-183, 93-203 thru 93-205 and 79-82 and 79-84. **Councilor Barbour motioned to refer to the City Clerk's Office to work with Planning Board to establish a Public Hearing. So Voted.**

Com. from Chairman, Taunton Planning Board – Proposed Zoning Map Amendment – Weir Street. A request to rezone from Industrial to Urban Residential District and Industrial to Business District-Property ID 78-252 thru 78-259, 78-262 and a portion of 78-519. **Motion was made to refer to the City Clerk's Office to work with Planning Board to establish a Public Hearing. So Voted.**

Com. from Superintendent, Richard W. Gross, Bristol-Plymouth Regional Technical School District – Notifying on approved budget. The City of Taunton FY014 total assessment will be \$4,326,732. **Motion was made to refer to Budget Hearings and Director. So Voted.**

Councilor Barbour received com. from Al Mendonca regarding the end of Cherry Avenue where it has been turned into a dumping ground for lawn furniture, bottles/cans, leaves/branches, and prefilled syringes. **Motion was made to refer to DPW to go out to this site and clean these items up. Also possibly be a top clean-up spot for Earth Day. So Voted.**

So Voted.**

Council Barbour informed that there will be a tour of the landfill on Saturday, April 20th at 10am.

Councilor McCaul received a letter from the City of Dudley, Office of the Board of Selectmen regarding a filing with legislation through their local State Representative Peter Durant on Chapter 70 Formula. **He motioned to refer to the Mayor's Office and for the information to be included in the Council packet for next week. So Voted.**

Councilor McCaul informed that there will be a hearing on Friday, April 19th at the Public Library to talk about the Pediatric Unit at Morton Hospital.

Councilor Pottier received a call from an individual in Middleboro regarding Project Life Saver. **Councilor Pottier motioned to refer Project Lifesaver, which is a bracelet program that was designed to help aid in the search of Alzheimer patients in the event that they become lost, to the Committee on Police and License and the Police Chief to determine if this is something the City of Taunton would like to join. So Voted.**

Councilor Costa-Hanlon stated that recently a school nurse from the Friedman Middle School saved the life of a child and was recognized at the school level. **She motioned to refer to the Mayor's Office for issuance of a Citation of Recognition and to invite her to be present during a Council Meeting. So Voted. City Clerk spoke with Alyssa concerning this issue.**

Councilor Costa-Hanlon stated that there are a few areas in the City that does not have handicapped accessible crosswalks: St. Anthony, St. Jude the Apostle Parish and their Faith Formation Center. **She motioned to refer to the DPW to see if there is anything that could be done to make them handicap accessible as there are no curb cuts, and report back to the Council on this matter. So Voted.**

Motion made and seconded to adjourn at 7:45P.M. So Voted.



THE COMMITTEE ON POLICE AND LICENSE

PRESENT WERE: COUNCILOR SHERRY COSTA-HANLON, CHAIRMAN AND COUNCILORS CLEARY AND BARBOUR. ALSO PRESENT WERE POLICE CHIEF EDWARD WALSH AND DETECTIVE DENNIS SMITH

MEETING CALLED TO ORDER AT 6:12 P.M.

1. MEET WITH THE POLICE CHIEF AND DETECTIVE SMITH ON THE FOLLOWING APPLICATIONS FOR APPOINTMENT AS CONSTABLE:

A. DESMOND CHOW, 7 MAIN STREET, TAUNTON – RENEWAL

MOTION: MOVE APPROVAL FOR CIVIL PROCESS. SO VOTED.

B. HERVE VANDAL, JR., 82 REED STREET, NEW BEDFORD, MA – RENEWAL

DETECTIVE SMITH INFORMED THE COMMITTEE THAT THE POLICE DEPARTMENT LICENSE DIVISION FINDS NOTHING EXCEPT THE RESIDENCY RESTRICTION CONTAINED IN TAUNTON CITY ORDINANCE 18-4 THAT WOULD PREVENT THE APPROVAL OF THE APPLICATION OF HERVE VANDAL.

THE CHIEF STATED THAT THE PROBLEM IS THAT THIS IS A RENEWAL, AND HE IS NOT SURE HOW OLD THIS ONE IS. THE CHIEF ALSO NOTED THAT THERE IS A CONSTABLE THAT HAS BEEN ONE FOR OVER 40 YEARS AND DOES NOT LIVE IN THE CITY, HE DID BUT HAS SINCE MOVED OUT OF THE CITY, AND HE HAS BEEN RENEWED EACH TIME HIS APPLICATION HAS COME IN.

COUNCILOR BARBOUR ASKED IF THERE WERE ANY CONSTABLES CURRENTLY IN THE CITY THAT ARE NON RESIDENTS. THE CHIEF SAID YES, THERE ARE AT LEAST 5 OR 6.

THE CHIEF SAID THAT HIS ONLY ISSUE IS THE LEGALITY BASED UPON THE CITY'S CURRENT ORDINANCE. HE DOES NOT THINK THIS IS AN ISSUE UNDER STATE LAW, BUT THE ORDINANCES PUT A RESTRICTION ON IT, A RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT. HE DOES NOT KNOW WHEN IT WAS ENACTED AND WHY IT WAS ENACTED.

THE CHAIRMAN REFERRED THIS MATTER FOR 2-3 WEEKS AND ALSO REFERRED IT TO THE LAW DEPARTMENT AND POLICE CHIEF FOR REVIEW.

2. MEET WITH THE POLICE CHIEF AND DETECTIVE SMITH ON THE PETITION OF ALI ABOUZEID, 73 CAVALIER AVE., TAUNTON FOR RENEWAL OF OLD GOLD LICENSE D/B/A HANNOUSH JEWELERS, 2 GALLERIA MALL DRIVE

MOTION: TO EXCUSE COUNCILOR BARBOUR FROM THIS ITEM. SO VOTED.

MOTION: MOVE APPROVAL. SO VOTED.

3. MEET WITH THE POLICE CHIEF AND DETECTIVE SMITH ON THE PETITION OF DMITRIY KIM, 161 YORK ST., STOUGHTON, MA FOR A NEW OLD GOLD LICENSE AND SECOND HAND ARTICLE LICENSE FOR TANZI INTERNATIONAL INC. D/B/A BLING 103, 103 MAIN ST., TAUNTON

MOTION: MOVE APPROVAL. SO VOTED.

THE CHIEF AND DETECTIVE SMITH REPORTED THAT THERE ARE 12-13 PEOPLE THAT ARE OLD GOLD LICENSES, BUT ONLY 2 HAVE COME IN FOR RENEWALS. THEY ALL EXPIRE APRIL 30TH. THE CHIEF WANTED TO MAKE THE COMMITTEE AWARE OF THIS. IT WAS ALSO NOTED THAT IT IS NOT JUST OLD GOLD LICENSES, THERE ARE MANY OTHERS THAT ARE SET TO EXPIRE ON APRIL 30TH.

IT WAS ALSO NOTED THAT REGARDING CLASS II LICENSES THERE ARE NEW PETITIONS IN THE FILE. QUESTIONED WAS WHETHER THERE IS A LIST, AS DETECTIVE SMITH HAS NOT SEE THE LIST, NOR HAS

THE POLICE CHIEF SEEN THE LIST. IT WAS RECOMMENDED THAT THEY SPEAK WITH THE CITY CLERK OFF LINE.

4. MEET WITH THE POLICE CHIEF TO DISCUSS ENFORCEMENT OF ILLEGAL DUMPING

THE CHAIRMAN STATED THAT THIS WAS BROUGHT UP BECAUSE THERE WAS A MATTER THAT WAS BROUGHT UP IN THE FULL COUNCIL MEETING ABOUT TICKETING AND THINGS LIKE THAT. IT WAS DISCUSSED THAT THE 21D TICKETS WOULD HAVE TO GO UNDER THE CHIEF'S PERVIEW AS THE CHIEF ENFORCEMENT OFFICER, AND SOMEONE WAS WONDERING IF THE CHIEF BELIEVES THAT THE POLICE DEPARTMENT WOULD BE ABLE TO WRITE TICKETS AND GO AND ENFORCE THE LEGAL DUMPING ISSUE, OR IS THAT SOMETHING THAT WILL BE UNDER HIS PERVIEW, BUT NOT ENFORCED BY THE POLICE DEPARTMENT.

THE CHIEF SAID, THAT AS WAS EXPLAINED TO HIM, THEY ARE A CATCH ALL AGENCY FOR 21D. EVEN IF IT WAS SPECIFICALLY GIVEN BY ANOTHER AGENCY, THE POLICE DEPARTMENT OWNS ITS. THEY HAVE WORKED WITH MARY ELLEN BENKER, ZONING ENFORCEMENT OFFICER ON SOME ISSUES, BUT HE SAID IT IS NOT EFFECTIVE. THERE IS NOTHING TELLING A PERSON TO PICK UP TRASH, THERE IS NO RESOLUTION, THERE IS NOTHING TELLING THAT PERSON TO DO WHAT THE TICKET WAS ISSUED FOR.

COUNCILOR BARBOUR SAID HE AGREES, PEOPLE IGNORE THE LAW. THE MAYOR IS THINKING OF PUTTING A PART TIME PERSON ON FOR TRASH ENFORCEMENT. THE CHIEF WAS ASKED TO GIVE SOME LANGUAGE FOR AN ORDINANCE WITH SOME TEETH IN IT FOR ENFORCEMENT.

COUNCILOR CLEARY SAID THAT THE ORDINANCE COMMITTEE HAS BEEN WORKING ON A DRAFT OF THE NUISANCE ORDINANCE.

THE CHAIRMAN NOTED THAT STIFFER FINES MAY HELP AND WORK AS A DETERRENT.

THE CHIEF NOTED THAT 2 SEPARATE ISSUES ARE HERE, FIRST THE ISSUE OF RESIDENTS PUTTING TRASH IN FRONT OF THEIR PROPERTY AND JUST LEAVING IT THERE, AND SECOND THE ISSUE OF PEOPLE ILLEGALLY DUMPING ON THE SIDE OF THE ROAD. 21D TICKETS WOULD DEAL WITH THE TRASH BEING LEFT IN FRONT OF RESIDENTS' HOMES, BUT THE ILLEGAL DUMPING WOULD PROBABLY FALL UNDER STATE LAW.

THE CHAIRMAN SAID THE POINT OF THIS BEING REFERRED TO THIS COMMITTEE IS TO MAKE SURE THERE IS AN APPETITE WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT, AND THAT THE CHIEF AGREES, THAT WHAT THE COMMITTEE HAS BEEN TOLD, WHICH IS THAT NO MATTER IF THERE IS GOING TO BE A PART TIME PERSON, NO MATTER WHERE THAT PERSON HANGS THEIR HAT, WHETHER IT IS D.P.W., BOARD OF HEALTH, ULTIMATELY, IF THEY ARE GOING TO WRITE 21D TICKETS, WHICH SHE BELIEVES THE ORDINANCE ANTICIPATES, AND SHE BELIEVES THAT WAS THE APPETITE OF THE COUNCIL AND THE MAYOR, IT IS GOING TO HAVE TO ULTIMATELY COME UNDER THE POLICE DEPARTMENT'S PERVIEW. THE POINT OF THIS WAS TO SEE, FIRST OF ALL, IF THE CHIEF AGREES THAT WOULD BE WHAT WOULD HAPPEN UNDER 21D.

THE CHIEF SAID THAT THERE HAVE BEEN MANY 21D TICKETS WRITTEN, THE PEOPLE EITHER PAY THEM OR THE DISTRICT COURT DISMISSES THEM. REGARDLESS, THE ISSUE IS STILL THERE. WITHOUT SPECIFIC PERFORMANCE ORDERED BY A JUDGE, THEY ARE USUALLY NOT EFFECTIVE.

5. MEET WITH THE POLICE CHIEF FOR AN UPDATE ON LICENSE ENFORCEMENT.

THE CHAIRMAN STATED THAT THE COMMITTEE HAS KIND OF ALREADY DONE THIS. SHE FURTHER STATED THAT IT SOUNDS LIKE DETECTIVE SMITH'S BIGGEST ISSUE IS IN THE PROCESS, AND A MEETING WAS HELD ON THIS LAST YEAR. THE CHAIRMAN WILL RESEND AN E-MAIL SHE SENT AFTER THAT MEETING.

6. MEET WITH THE POLICE CHIEF TO DISCUSS STAFFING, EQUIPMENT AND NEEDS OF THE TAUNTON POLICE DEPARTMENT

THE CHIEF STATED THAT HE NEEDS BODIES. HE IS DOWN 13 OFFICERS OVER 10 YEARS AND HE IS TRYING TO DO MORE WITH LESS. HE HAS TRIED TO CHANGE SOME OF THE PERSONNEL ASSIGNMENTS WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT TO MAXIMIZE UTILIZATION OF OFFICERS. HE DISBANDED THE VICE UNIT AND REASSEMBLED IT AS A STREET CRIMES UNIT WITH A BROADER FOCUS ON STREET BASED ISSUES. THEY DON'T DO JUST VICE INVESTIGATIONS, THEY DO OTHER INVESTIGATIONS. HE HAS EXPANDED THE DETECTIVE DIVISION BY 1. HE FURTHER STATED THE TECHNOLOGY OF CRIME IS CHANGING RAPIDLY AND THEIR ABILITY TO DO CERTAIN THINGS NEEDS EXPANSION. COMPUTER BASED CRIMES ARE A REAL ISSUE. THE COMMUNITY POLICING PROGRAM IS REALLY NOT COMMUNITY POLICING ANYMORE. THE PROGRAM THAT WAS IS BASICALLY GUTTED. SINCE 2010 HE HAS TAKEN 3 BODIES OUT OF THERE. ONE ENDED UP AT THE HIGH SCHOOL AS AN ADDITIONAL SRO PRIMARILY BECAUSE THEY BROUGHT THE 8TH GRADE THERE. THE COMMUNITY POLICE UNIT HAS BASICALLY BECOME WHAT THE CHIEF IS CALLING A COMMUNITY SUPPORT TEAM. INSTEAD OF A GEOGRAPHICAL POLICE OFFICER THEY ARE NOW PROBLEM SOLVING OFFICERS ON SPECIFIC ISSUES. ONE IS DEALING WITH ELDERLY ISSUES AND THE OTHER OFFICERS ARE SPENDING THEIR TIME BETWEEN HOUSING AUTHORITY AND DISTRESSED PROPERTIES WE HAVE IN THE CITY, TRYING TO BUILD SUPPORT WITHIN THE COMMUNITY.

HE HAS EXPANDED THE LICENSING DIVISION AND MADE THAT A FULL TIME RESPONSIBILITY FOR DETECTIVE SMITH AND LIEUTENANT MCCABE.

HE HAS 3 CAPTAINS EACH IN CHARGE OF A DIVISION. HE HAS A DETECTIVE CAPTAIN, A DETECTIVE LIEUTENANT AND A DETECTIVE SERGEANT ASSIGNED TO THE DETECTIVES, SO THAT IS 3 SUPERVISORS WITHIN THE DETECTIVE DIVISION. HE HAS AN ADMINISTRATIVE CAPTAIN, UNDER HIM IS A COURT OFFICER THAT IS A LIEUTENANT, A TRAINING SERGEANT WHO IS BASICALLY THEIR IN HOUSE FORENSICS GUY WHO HANDLES THE EXPLOITATION VIA COMPUTERS, EXPLOITATION OF CHILDREN, ETC. STREET CRIMES HAS A SUPERVISOR WHO IS ACTUALLY A WORKING SUPERVISOR, HE IS PART OF THE UNIT. THE CHIEF PROVIDED THE COMMITTEE WITH A SPREADSHEET SHOWING UPCOMING RETIREMENTS, A DOCUMENT ENTITLED PRESENT PATROL STAFFING MODEL AND A THIRD TITLED TAUNTON POLICE DEPARTMENT SWORN PERSONNEL BREAKDOWN.

MOTION: DOCUMENTS TO BE PART OF THE RECORD. SO VOTED.

THE CHIEF STATED THAT HE IS ALWAYS IN AN OVERTIME SITUATION. HIS OVERTIME BUDGET IS CLOSE TO \$2 MILLION. THERE ARE ALSO SOME OFFICERS OUT ON INJURIES AND 2 WITH CATASTROPHIC ILLNESSES. THE NUMBERS THE CHIEF IS USING ARE BASED ON A 1988 STUDY.

IN THE CHART ADDRESSING RETIREMENTS, THE CHIEF NOTED THAT AS OF DECEMBER 31, 2013, THERE WILL BE 16 OFFICERS THAT WILL BE MAXED OUT AT 80% AND COULD DECIDE TO RETIRE AT ANY TIME. AS OF NEXT YEAR THERE WILL BE 17. THE FOLLOWING YEAR HE WILL HAVE 2 RETIREMENTS AND 16 PEOPLE ELIGIBLE. IN 2015 HE HAS 2 MANDATORY RETIREMENTS BECAUSE OF AGE, IN THE NEXT 10 YEARS THERE ARE 25 PEOPLE THAT WILL HAVE TO RETIRE AT A ESTIMATED COST OF \$2.4 MILLION. THERE WILL BE A GREAT GAP IN PERSONNEL IN THE NEXT FEW YEARS. THE AVERAGE AGE IN THE DEPARTMENT IS ABOUT 50, THE YOUNGEST GUY HE HAS IS IN HIS EARLY 30'S.

THE CHIEF REPORTED THAT THERE ARE CURRENTLY 49 PATROLMEN ASSIGNED TO PATROL. THIS BREAKS DOWN TO 15 ON THE FIRST RELIEF, 19 ON THE SECOND RELIEF AND 13 ON THE THIRD RELIEF. ON AVERAGE THERE ARE 4 PATROLMEN INJURED AT A GIVEN TIME. CURRENTLY, AS STATED ABOVE, THERE ARE 2 OFFICERS OUT WITH CATASTROPHIC ILLNESSES. BASED UPON CALCULATIONS, THE CITY SHOULD HAVE AT LEAST 51 PATROLMEN ASSIGNED TO PATROL, AND IDEALLY 72. THE CHIEF HAS REQUESTED 4 MORE PATROLMEN, AND IS ANTICIPATING 2 RETIREMENTS IN 2 YEARS. COUNCILORS BARBOUR AND



CLEARY BOTH WOULD LIKE TO SEE THE DEPARTMENT GET AT LEAST 4 NEW HIRES.

REGARDING EQUIPMENT, THE LAST TIME THE CITY BOUGHT NEW CRUSERS WAS IN 2007. THEY DID GET
SOME THROUGH GIFTS OR THE USE OF DRUG MONEY RECENTLY. THEIR PRIORITY IS LINE CRUISERS.
